Breme's residents faced an ongoing water crisis that affected every part of daily life. A single hand-dug well served as their only water source. The hand pump used to draw water from it frequently broke down, leaving community members uncertain when they would have access. In times of scarcity, women and children walked over a mile to the next town to collect water—often in bad weather and carrying heavy containers. These long walks were exhausting and left barely any time for school, work, or family responsibilities. The physical toll and emotional stress of this task only added to the burden on families already struggling to meet basic needs.

Robert Ayomah, a 39-year-old resident, shared about an additional barrier to good health residents faced when using the hand-dug well: “We faced another serious challenge: the infestation of microbial worms and red worms in the well. As a result, many residents suffered from illnesses with no clear cure, which affected both their physical and social well-being.”

Community leaders knew that something needed to change. When they heard about the work that Living Water International was doing in the area, they reached out.

Living Water Ghana responded by drilling a new borehole and installing a hand pump just a short walk from residents' homes. Now community members will flourish for years to come!
