



From Fearful to Thankful

Fort-Liberté, Haiti

Gang violence forced Pastor Joseph and the 27 children of the Christian Society of Haiti to flee their home in Désarmes. As the leader of a ministry for children with no parents or guardians, Pastor Joseph was hoping to lead the kids in his care to peace and safety in a new town, Fort-Liberté.

But what awaited them in Fort-Liberté was another crisis—a severe lack of safe water.

“We escaped the terror of gangs only to face the desperation of thirst,” Pastor Joseph recalled. “There was no water to drink, bathe in, or cook with. Caring for 27 children without water was overwhelming. We feared sickness, dehydration, and despair.”

But just when hope seemed out of reach, a connection led them to Living Water International—and everything changed.

“Their response was like finding a cup of water in the desert,” Pastor Joseph remarked.

Living Water Haiti didn’t just provide access to clean, safe water—they brought life.

The children could drink, bathe, and eat safely again. Additionally, the organization offered sanitation and hygiene training, empowering the community to protect their health and dignity.
